



Quality Personal Home Care Services Client Resource Information **Regarding Indiana Pathways for Aging Hoosiers**

Who is eligible for the Pathways program?

Pathways is a Managed Care Program for Indiana Medicaid members. To be eligible for the Pathway program, you must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- PathWays is for individuals who are 60 years of age and older and are eligible for Medicaid based on age, blindness, or disability.
- Can be receiving long-term support services including:
 - Residing in a nursing or long-term care facility
 - Approved for an Aged and Disabled waiver.
- Be on the Behavioral and Primary Health Coordination program.
- Individuals in PathWays may also have Medicare at the same time.

Medicaid members that are not eligible for PathWays include:

- Those under 60
- Healthy Indiana Plan member of any age
- Hoosier Healthwise members of any age
- Division of Disability and Rehabilitative Services waiver members including:
 - Family Support Waiver
 - CIH (Community Integration and Habilitation Waiver)
- Traumatic Brain Injury Waiver
- Room and Board members
- Medicaid members on the End Stage Renal Disease waiver
- Breast and Cervical cancer members on MA12
- Intellectual and developmental disability residents in intermediate care facilities



- Members eligible for Emergency Services Only due to citizenship status

How do I know if I am enrolled in the Pathways?

If you are enrolled into the Pathways program, you will receive a letter from the Division of Family Resources or the Enrollment Broker.

Do I still need to renew my coverage for the Pathway; if yes, how do I go about doing so?

You must renew your coverage every year. You can do this by visiting your local Division of Family Resources office or through your portal account at <https://fssabenefits.in.gov/bp/#/>. Your health plan (Anthem, Humana or UnitedHealthcare) can also assist you in renewing your coverage.

How long am I eligible for Pathway?

Every 12 months members are required to complete the eligibility redetermination process. This includes financial and medical eligibility. If something changes with your information, FSSA may send a request that requires a response to continue eligibility before the 12-month period ends. FSSA may ask you again to verify your income and your assets.

Where can I apply for the Pathway?

You can first apply for Medicaid online, print an application, or have an application mailed to you via the FSSA Benefits Portal <https://fssabenefits.in.gov/bp/#/>, or contact an Indiana Navigator <https://in.accessgov.com/idoi/Forms/Page/idoi/find-a-navigator/1>

Will my Medicaid benefits change in Pathway?

You will continue to receive the same Medicaid benefits in the Pathways program.



What additional services are available to people enrolled in the Pathways program?

Care coordination services are available to every PathWays member. Members who meet the functional eligibility requirements have access to service coordination and the additional services:

- Adult day services
- Adult family care
- Assisted living.
- Attendant care
- Home modifications
- Health care coordination
- Home-delivered meals
- Nutritional supplements
- Personal emergency response systems
- Respite
- Specialized medical equipment
- Structured family care
- Transportation
- Vehicle modifications
